Learn: about Global Citizen Journey (GCJ), a unique Seattle-based nonprofit that welcomes a new paradigm by exploring the question: How do we awaken to our interconnectedness, our grassroots power, and our mutual responsibility so we are inspired to act as fully engaged global citizens? You will hear about our powerful delegations to the Niger Delta, Nigeria 2005, and Axim, Ghana 2006 and be invited to join an inspirational journey to Burundi in July 2009.

GCJ Burundi 2009: We will bring 15 US delegates to live and work for 2 ½ weeks with 15 diverse Burundians (Hutu and Tutsi. We'll have dialogues and workshops for cultural understanding, host Town Halls, and engage in community service to support "Kazozza Kumukenyezi" ("The woman's future"). This inspiring farming collective was initiated by 104 single mothers who decided to grow food instead of begging to support their families. We'll buy the land, tools, seeds, fertilizer and bring our hearts and hands to work side by side.

Meet: Prosper Ndabishuriye, passionate humanitarian, founder of JRMD/YRWD (Youth in Reconstruction of a World in Destruction), and GCJ's Host Director for the Burundi project, is in the US this fall and so will be able to join us. Since 1994 Prosper has been promoting Reconciliation & Peace through the rebuilding of hope and homes of the traumatized hearts caused by ethnic wars, injustice, and divisions in the region. JRMD/YRMD has been able to rebuild over 2000 houses. This action has contributed to rebuilding peace and reconciliation among the Burundian people.
